Fire Prevention

The best way to practice fire safety is to make sure a fire doesn't break out in the first place. That means you should always be aware of potential hazards in your home. Start by keeping these tips in mind.

Check all electrical appliances, cords, and outlets

- □ Are your electrical appliances in good condition, without loose or frayed cords or plugs?
- □ Are your outlets overloaded with plugs from the TV, computer, printer, video game system, and stereo?
- \Box Are you overusing an extension cord?
- □ Do the light fixtures in your home contain bulbs that are the correct wattage?
- Does your home contain GFCIs (ground-fault circuit interrupters) and/or AFCIs (arc-fault circuit interrupters), which prevent electrical shock and fire by shutting off faulty circuits?

Look around your house for potential problems. And unless you're a trained electrician, be careful about do-it-yourself electrical projects. Studies have shown that many home fires are caused by improper installation of electrical devices.

Other tips:

- Replace or professionally repair any appliances that spark, smell unusual, or overheat.
- Don't run electrical wires under rugs.
- ☐ Make sure lamps and night-lights are not touching bedspreads, drapes, or other fabrics.
- Use caution when using electric blankets.
- Don't let kids use kitchen appliances by themselves and supervise any art or science projects that involve electrical devices.
- Cover any outlets that are not in use with plastic safety covers if you have toddlers or young children in your home.

Shiloh Garden Club News


The Shiloh Garden Club meets each month at 10:45 a.m. in the Dover Community Center. Everyone is welcome.

Dover Ambulance would like to tell Dover Residents about the Handicap Van Service we offer.

This piece of equipment is for handicap individuals that are in wheel chairs or bed bound, who need transport to doctors offices, surgical appointments, trips home from the hospital and other transport needs. This unit is not staffed by medical personnel. Dover Ambulance is nonprofit and the rates for the service reflect that. For example a one way trip via wheelchair includes the first hour and 20 miles for \$40, please call for other types of transport pricing. This type of transportation is not covered by insurance so it is a out of pocket expense. We are licensed by the PUC, and the 911 ambulance membership does not include this separate service. To Trap or Not to Trap, That is the Question.

Question from a resident: Should I have a building trap and sewer vent outside my house?

Answer: Ask your plumber.

According to the International Construction Codes that the Dover Township Board of Supervisors adopted, a building trap& vent for your building sewer may not be required. If you go on the internet and search "sewer traps", you will find a lot of controversy about them. Some plumbers curse them, others bless them. If the house piping and all its drains and vents are **properly installed and maintained**, an outside trap and vent on your building sewer may be redundant. It all depends on many complex factors about the location, depths, slopes, etc., and even temperature. Many communities do not require them, and others mandate them.

My personal opinion as a homeowner is that a building trap/vent for a building sewer is cheap insurance. In my experience, 99.9%+ of the buildings do not need them. However, how can I be sure my home is not one of the 0.1% that may benefit by having a building trap? It does not guarantee that sewage will never backup into my home (only a backflow preventer can do that), but it lessens the chances for sewer odors and fumes entering my house. If the township smoke-tests the sewers in your neighborhood, a trap should also keep the test smoke out of your house.

Note that cleanouts are required at the curb, just outside the building, and at any change of building sewer direction. Do not bury nor pave over your cleanouts. You need access in case of blockage.

WATER SYSTEM INFORMATION:

This report shows our water quality and what it means. If you have any questions about this report, please contact Churk Parley at 717-202-3614. If you wish, the township supervisors meet on the 2nd and 4th Mandays of each month at the township building on West Canal Road.

WATER SOURCE:

Our water comes from 10 wells located inside the township's boundaries. Our treatment consists of Disinfection only. The township also buys water from the York Water Company. York's water comes from the South Rouch of the Codmos Creek and receives complete treatment (flocculation, sedimentation, and filtration) in addition to disinfection.

A Source Water Assessment of our source(s) was completed in 2007 by the Pa Department of Environmental Protection (PADRP. The Assessment has fixed that our sources are potentially susceptible to nonsplicturing facilities, community pools, residential activities, transportation corriders, and public some linus. The Township utilizes new water quality mentioning and wellhand protection activities to reduce the risks of source water contamination. Owned, our sources have little risk of significant contamination. Summary reports of our Assessment are available at <u>wave depush state proce</u>, bayward: source water. Complete reports were distributed to manicipalities, the water supplier, local planning agencies, and DRP offices. Copies of the complete reports are available for review at the PADRP South Control Regional Office, Records Management Unit at 717–705–4701.

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Incomecompromised persons such as persons with cancer molecging chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other income system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These persons should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to becaus the risk of infection by *Copytoporodism* and other microhial contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hottine (800-426-4791).

MONITORING YOUR WATER:

We continely maxim for contoninouts in your drinking unter according to federal and state hors. The State allows us to manitor for some contaminants less than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants do not charge frequently. Some of our data is from prior years in accordance with the Safe Drinking Water Act. The date has been noted on the sampling results table.

DEFINITIONS AND ABBREVIATIONS:

Active Lond (AL): The concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

Meximum Contentional Lovel (MCL): The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

EDUCATIONAL INFORMATION:

The sources of drinking water (both top water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, pands, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it distuives naturally occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from homon activity. Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

- Microbial cantoninants, such as vicenes and bacteria, which may came from searge treatment phote, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and livestock.
- Increasing contractions, such as suits and metals, which can be naturally occurring or result from urban strum, water runoff, industrial or domestic waterwater discharges, oil and gas production, mining or farming.
- Perticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources agriculture, toban starm water month, and residential mes.
- Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-pandacts of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also, came from gas stations, when starm water month, and septic systems.
- Rediractive contaminants, which can be rationally occurring, or be the result of all and gas production and mining activities.

In order to ensure that top water is safe to drink, KPA and DKP prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. FDA and DKP regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which must provide the same protection for the public.

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection. Agency's Solie Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

OTHER INFORMATION:

"If present, elevated levels of lead can cause vericus health problems, especially for pregnent women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. Dover Township is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been althing for several hours, you can minimize the putential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or coaking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Information on lead in drinking water, testing methods, and steps you can take to minimize exposure is available from the Sale Orinking Water Holline or at http://www.epa.gov/balewaterflead."




