FLOOD INSURANCE

Through FEMA, the Federal Government requires that any building or improvement located within a mapped flood area have flood insurance. FEMA has recently updated these maps, using newer technology and topographic information to better map floods. The result of this update is that the mapped flood areas have changed in many instances, either increasing or decreasing. This may affect your property and your need for flood insurance. These maps are available online at the link below. They are also available at the Township office for review. The new maps are not yet in effect, and property owners have an opportunity now to inspect the maps. Should property owners disagree with the mapped flood areas, they can file an appeal, which must be supported with engineering calculations. These appeals must be filed to FEMA before May 6, 2014.

WATER SYSTEM INFORMATION: This report shows our water quality and what it means. If you have any questions about this report or concerning your water utility, please contact Chuck Farley at 717-292-3634. We want you to be informed about your water supply. If you want to learn more, please attend any of our regularly scheduled Board of Supervisors meetings. They are normally scheduled the 2nd and 4th Monday of the month, unless the date happens to be a holiday. Call the Township Office (717-292-3634) to confirm the Board of Supervisors meeting dates.

SOURCE(S) OF WATER: Our water sources are 10 wells located inside the physical boundaries of Dover Township. The water from our wells is disinfected as the only form of treatment. However in 2013 the township started construction of a permitted Nitrate Removal system at well 10. Well 10 is expected to be placed in service with its Nitrate Removal system by the summer of 2014. We also purchase fully treated and disinfected water from the York Water Company.

A Source Water Protection Plan (SWP Plan) was completed in 2010 by SSM Group, Inc. The Plan was paid for by the PA Department of Environmental Protection (Pa. DEP). The SWP Plan found that our source(s) are potentially susceptible to RCRA facilities, golf courses, transportations corridors, commercial property, gas stations, underground fuel tanks, quarries, farming and manure application practices, and natural gas pipe lines. However due to water quality monitoring and the regulation of land use activities within our well head protection areas, the risk of contamination is low.

Our SWP Plan is available for public review at the Dover Township Municipal Building, 2480 West Canal Road, Dover, PA 17315. Call Chuck Farley, PWD at 717-292-3634 is you wish to schedule a review of the SWP Plan.

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by Cryptosporidium and other microbial contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

MONITORING YOUR WATER: We routinely monitor for contaminants in your drinking water according to federal and state laws. The following tables show the results of our monitoring for the period of January 1 to December 31, 2013. The State allows us to monitor for some contaminants less than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants do not change frequently. Some of our data is from prior years in accordance with the Safe Drinking Water Act. The date has been noted on the sampling results table.

DEFINITIONS:

Action Level (AL) - The concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) - The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

Maximum Contaminant Level Goal (MCLG) - The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level (MRDL) - The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.

Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level Goal (MRDLG) - The level of a drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.

Minimum Residual Disinfectant Level (MinRDL) - The minimum level of residual disinfectant required at the entry point to the distribution system. **Treatment Technique (TT)** - A required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.

EDUCATIONAL INFORMATION: The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity. Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

* Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife. * Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban stormwater run-off, industrial or domestic

wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming.

* Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban stormwater runoff, and residential uses.

- * Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban stormwater runoff, and septic systems.
- * Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally-occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA and DEP prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. FDA and DEP regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which must provide the same protection for public health.

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

INFORMATION ABOUT LEAD: If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. Dover Township is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Information on lead in drinking water, testing methods, and steps you can take to minimize exposure is available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline or at http://www.epa.gov/safewater/lead.

NOTE: We overlooked collecting a sample for atrazine at entry point 106 (well 7) in 2013. However the well was not in use in 2013 thus leading to the missed monitoring.



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n speaking with some residents recently who are new to our Community, it became apparent that they knew very little about our Township Fire Department. I hope in the next few paragraphs to educate you all about The Dover Township Volunteer Fire Department.

Currently, we are located at 3700-1 Davidsburg Rd, Dover, PA and cover primary responsibility for 49 square miles in Dover Township and about 24,000 residents. Our average call volumes for the last 3 years have been right around 600 emergency calls per year and we respond with an average of 11 members per call. This number of responders is significantly higher than the National average of 5 for all volunteer staffed stations. In an emergency, you need to call 911 to have us dispatched. For non-emergency questions, please call 717-292-4196. Our dispatch center is York County 911, they send out an emergency tone to our pagers or phones to notify our members of a call. Long gone is the old house siren that used to alert us of fire calls.

Our membership comes from all walks of life and our roster is about 40 members. Currently, we have 12 members who live at the station and provide responses when they are not at work. On average, we respond within 1 minute of being alerted because we work very hard to keep staffing at all times in the Township. In our line of work, time is our enemy, so, being alerted, responding and acting as quickly as possible are all important to affect a positive outcome on whatever the emergency may be. Some of our members, who respond from home are our Fire Police officers, respond directly to the scene, many use courtesy lights or blue lights to alert those around them that they are responding to an emergency. We ask that you please yield the right of way to them so they may travel safely to assist at the emergency scene.

We are obviously asked to respond to any type of fire call from brush fires, to vehicle fires, structure fires and trash fires. We also respond to vehicle accidents with injuries, with entrapment and to unknown injury accidents. We handle hazardous material spills in conjunction with the York County Haz-Mat team. We handle many different type of responses for industrial accidents, public service and technical rescue and provide valuable services to our surrounding communities through Mutual Aid agreements. Our members maintain all our equipment our personal protective equipment and our apparatus. We train constantly and look for new and better ways to serve our community. Our mantra is "whatever it takes!" All that being said, we have to do risk analysis at every incident that we are called to. Our officers will risk nothing to save nothing and risk everything to save a life. Often these decisions have to be made very quickly with limited information, but it's how we keep our members safe.

Our members are dedicated individuals, some with just a few years of experience, others with a lifetime commitment of 50 years. Our administrative staff is just as important as our first line firefighters as they fight inflation, bills, recruitment and fundraising. Funding for us comes from several streams. One is through a fire tax that covers about 1/3 of our total budget, the rest comes from all other fund raising that we do, including, Bingo and our Fund Drive. Please support us in any fund raising event that we hold.

Members provide coverage 24/7/365 days a year. No matter what time of the day or night, no matter how tired we are, we respond because we care. Because someone, somewhere, is having the worst day of their life, and we want to try to make a difference, to take an out of control situation and bring it back under control. To keep others from getting injured, or to stop property damage. I am very proud of our men and women as they make a difference every day in the lives of the people we come in contact with. I hope next time you see one of those big red trucks, or someone with a Station 9 apparel on you, have a better understanding and appreciation of the commitment that our Volunteers make, and I hope it makes you smile to know that we are there for you.

Be Safe and please maintain your Smoke Detectors, practice fire drills with your family and support your local Fire Department. If you ever have the need for support through a public education event, please feel free to contact us. We love teaching and informing.


