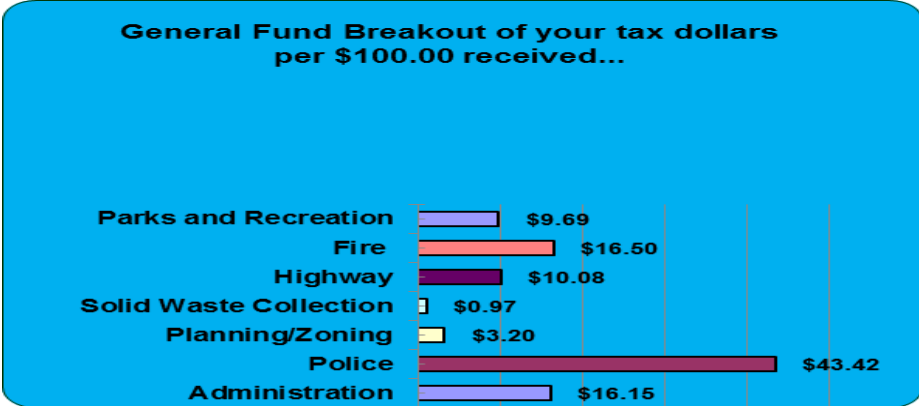




Dover Township is proud to present the highlights of the 2015 Budget. The Board of Supervisors has not increased taxes since 2008, when the millage rate was increased from .828 to 1 whole mil of tax. This means on a \$100,000 assessed home, we receive \$100.00 in real estate tax to use towards the General Fund Operations. Those operations include Parks and Recreation, Fire, Highway, Solid Waste Collection (Leaf and Brush Collection), Planning and Zoning, Police and Administration. The breakout of your \$100 in real estate taxes is shown in the chart below.

2015 will include various road and stormwater improvements. Stormwater work is planned for on Wilmar Drive, Anita Drive, Emig Mill Road and the outfall near Thunderbird Trailer Park. Road work has been slated for the Emig Mill Road (Overlay and base repair), North Salem Church Road (Reclamation), Palomino Road (Base repair) Paradise Road (Base repair), Pine Hill Road (Base repair), Rohlers Church Road/Mountain Road to Crone Road (overlay), Rohlers Church Road (Overlay), Tower Drive (Overlay) and sealcoating on Crone Road, Nursery Road, Old Carlisle Road, and Oriole Lane. In addition, approximately \$37,850 is allotted for bridge maintenance work on the following bridges: Butter, Clearview, Dairy, Fox Run, Pine Hill, Rohlers Church and Taxville. In addition, we will be replacing a large Dump Truck in our fleet of vehicles.

The Budget also includes maintenance work to the Township Building and Parks. New HVAC equipment is scheduled for the Municipal Building. Painting and repairs will be made to the Barn at the former Golf Course property.

The Sewer Collection System is currently under a consent order with the Department of Environmental Protection to resolve infiltration and inflow into the system. We have budgeted significant funds to make repairs as breaks, cracks or leaks are discovered within the system. We are currently utilizing a lining product on East Canal Road, a process that is less costly than digging up and replacing existing lines. In 2015, we intend to line the Cypress /Davidsburg Road area as well. A project is also anticipated for a portion of the Palomino Interceptor .

The Water System continues to work toward improvements to the system by looking to install mixing equipment at the Staunton Tank, investigating a new well location at the McNaughton/Bupp property, replacing water line on Hilton Avenue/Virginia Avenue and looping the Palomino/Sheppard Road area to create a tie in. We will also be creating a 5/10 year needs assessment of the Water System. In addition, the oldest water crew vehicle will be replaced this year.

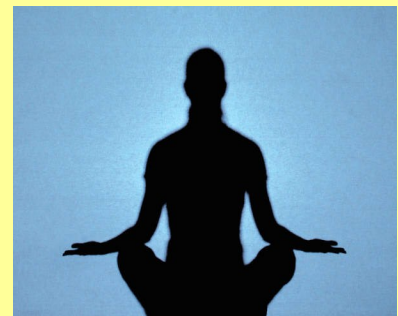

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

Acceptable Items:

- Aluminum food and beverage containers
- Glass food and beverage containers-brown, clear, or green
- Bi-Metal, Steel and Aerosol cans
- PET Plastic containers with the symbol #1 narrow neck containers only
- HDPE Plastic containers with the symbol #2 narrow neck containers such as milk and water bottles, detergent, shampoo, bleach bottles etc **without caps**
- Plastics with symbols #3,#4,#5,#6 #7 narrow and screw top containers
- Newsprint
- Cardboard-flattened in 2' x 2' bundles (may be placed in recycling bin along with other recycling)
- Residential mixed paper (Junk Mail, magazines, glossies, telephone books, printer/copier paper)
- Cereal Boxes



Non-Acceptable Items:

- Window or Auto glass, drinking glasses, mirrors, light bulbs, ceramic, porcelain, microwave trays, glass cookware/ bake ware
- Unnumbered plastic items
- Plastic Bags
- Salad/Deli containers, Plastic food tubs
- Household items such as cooking pots
- Batteries
- Cardboard/Paper with wax coating or liners
- Scrap metal, siding

Penn Waste will take ONE large item once a week with your regular trash pickup.

Public Works Outreach

What is I&I?

I&I is clean storm and/or groundwater that enters the sewer system through cracked pipes, leaky manholes, or improperly connected storm drains, down spouts and sump pumps. Most inflow comes from storm water and most infiltration comes from groundwater.

Inflow occurs when rainwater is misdirected into the sanitary sewer system instead of storm sewers. Examples are: roof leaders, yard and area drains, manhole covers, and cross connections from storm drains. The remedy for inflow is to remove improper connections to the sanitary sewer system.

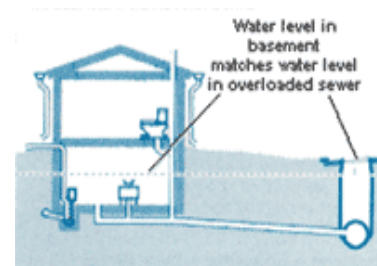
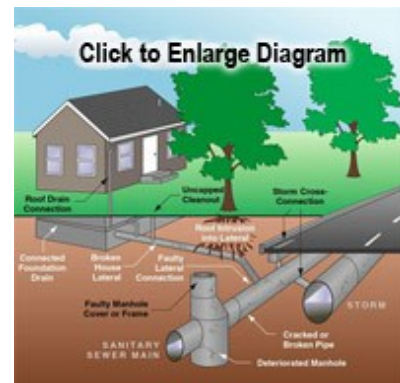
Infiltration occurs when ground water seeps into the sanitary sewer system through cracks or leaks in sewer pipes. The cracks or leaks may be caused by age related deterioration, loose joints, damage or root infiltration. The remedy for infiltration is repairing or replacing the leaking infrastructure.

What Problems Do I&I cause?

I&I are a cause of sanitary sewer overflows and backups that release raw sewage into the environment and homes. In addition, excess storm and ground water entering the sanitary sewer system through I&I results in increased wastewater treatment costs, which are passed on to the ratepayers.

How Can Overloaded Sanitary Sewers Cause Flooding In Your Home?

The water in an overloaded sewer flows at a higher level than normal. If the home has sanitary fixtures or floor drains that are below the higher, overload level, water can flow backwards through the sanitary sewer lines into the basement. The "Uniform Plumbing Code" 710.1 requires that "Drainage piping serving fixtures which have flood level rims located below the elevation of the next upstream manhole cover of the public or private sewer serving such drainage piping shall be protected from backflow of sewage by installing an approved type backwater

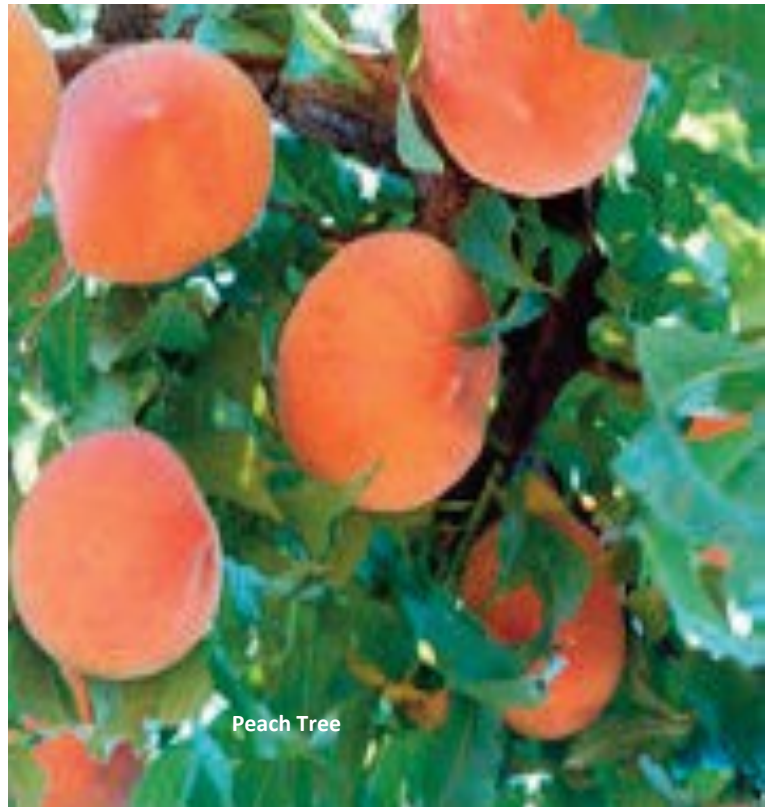

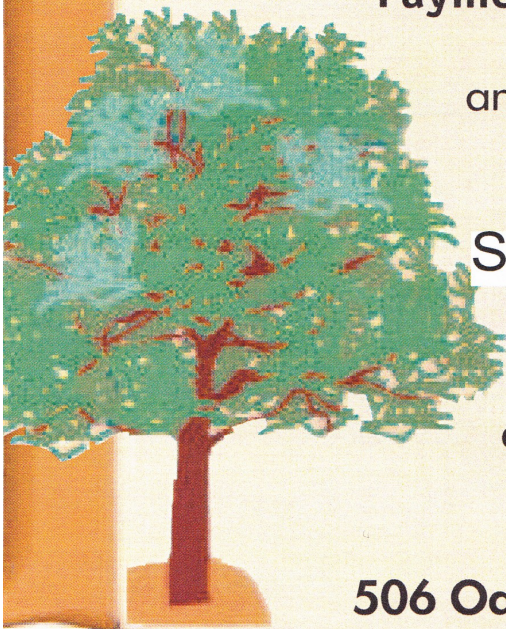

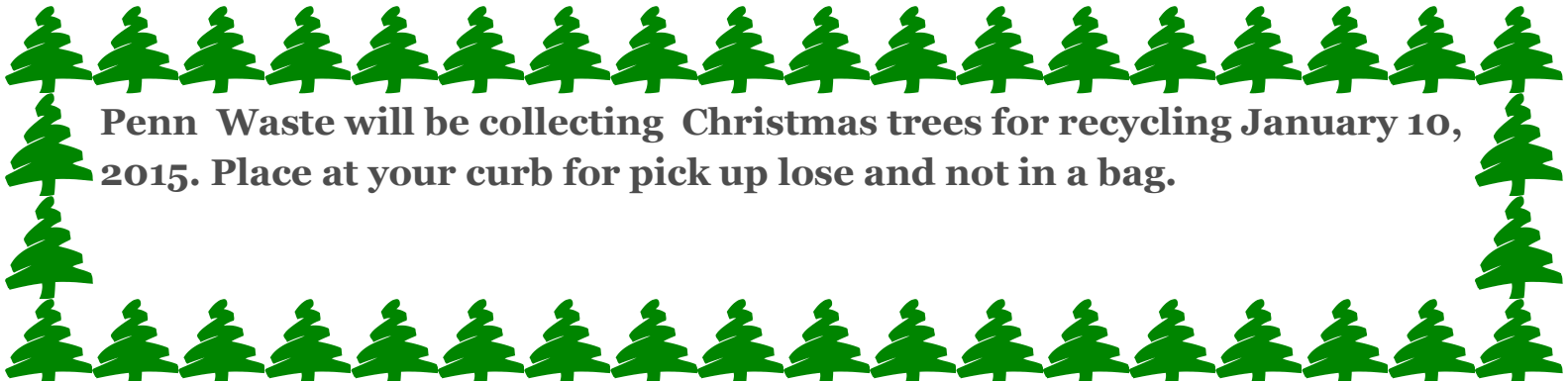
Checking for Leaks

A sudden increase in your water charges could indicate a water leak. Water leaks are often silent and unnoticeable until you get a high water bill.

To check for a leak:

- Turn off all faucets in and around the house.
- Make sure the dishwasher and washing machine are not on.
- Switch off the ice-maker.
- Find your water meter box which is usually located in your front yard near the property line.
- Look for a leak indicator on your meter (usually a small triangle dial visible through the meter sight glass).
- If the indicator is spinning, water is running through the meter and you have a leak.
- If you do not have a leak indicator, write down all of the numbers on the register including the position of the dial if there is one.
- Leave all of the water off in the house and check the meter again in one hour. If the dial has moved or the numbers have changed, you have a leak.
- If you verified a leak, you need to find out where it is.
- The most common culprit is a toilet. A hanging flapper valve or a flap that is not seated correctly can cause water to constantly seep from the tank to the bowl. The flapper valves and internal components do wear out, requiring servicing.
- Take the toilet tank lid off and see if you can either hear or see a leak. If not, place a few drops of food coloring in the tank (the back of the toilet). Let it sit for 15-20 minutes without flushing. Then check the bowl for traces of the food coloring. If the water in the bowl is colored, you have found a leak.
- Other common leaks are faucets that drip or slowly run. Make sure and check outside spigots and around the bottom of your hot water heater also. Even small leaks can add up quickly.
- If you have determined that you do have a leak and can't find it, then it could be underground. Most plumbing service companies have detection equipment and are experienced in finding underground leaks. The Dobbin Plantersville Water Service Corporation typically does not repair water leaks on the customer or "service" side of the meter and would not be involved in the repair.
