

## Welcome Wondrous Winter 2018 Budget Message from the Township Manager

Dover Township is proud to present the highlights of the 2018 Budget. No tax increase is projected in this budget. The Board of Supervisors has not increased real estate taxes since 2008, when the millage rate was increased from .828 to 1 whole mil of tax. This means on a \$100,000 assessed home, we receive \$100.00 in real estate tax to use towards the General Fund Operations. Those operations include Parks and Recreation, Fire, Highway, Solid Waste Collection (Leaf and Brush Collection), Planning and Zoning, Police and Administration. The

breakout of your \$100 in real estate taxes is shown in the chart below. 2018 will include various road and stormwater improvements. Grant funds were obtained in 2016 to perform a streambank stabilization project between Danielle and Willapa Drives and at the conclusion of 2017 all construction easements necessary have been obtained to proceed with the project. A left turn lane is scheduled to be installed on Davidsburg Road near Tower Drive and Jayne Lane this coming spring. Sealcoating will be performed on Pinchtown Road (Newer Pavement to North of Admire), Butter Road, Piney Hollow Road, Timberland Road, Blue Bird (South of Rohlers Church), Conewago Road (Route 74 to Fish & Game), and Conewago Road (Piney Hollow to Harmony Grove). Blacktopping will occur on Emig Mill Road (Route 74 to Mayfield), Blackberry Road (off-shoot), Rohlers Church Road (Crone Road to Circle Drive), and if funds are available Rohlers Church Road (Circle Drive to Kunkles Mill). Blacktop patching will also be performed on Emig School extended. Lining of a pipe located between Jessica and Abby Lanes is scheduled, as well as, a pipe replacement on Cherry Orchard and North Salem. A bridge on Emig Mill Road is also budgeted for repair. A traffic signal emergency pre-emption upgrade including five signals along Carlisle Road will also be funded.

The local ordinance of control is the Subdivision and Land Development Plan of Dover Township and the Dover Township Comprehensive Plan. Meetings are held at the Township Municipal Building, **2480 West Canal Road, Dover, Pennsylvania**, at 7:00 PM on the first (1<sup>st</sup>) Wednesday of the month.

### Sewer Authority

The Dover Township Sewer Authority is the owner and financier of the Wastewater Treatment Facility, a regional facility, for Dover Township. The body is a five member, staggered term, Authority authorized by the Authorities Act of 1945 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is a Non-Operating Authority due to a "Lease Back Agreement" of operation to the Township. Meetings are held at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, <u>851 Graffius Road, York, Pennsylvania</u>, at 7:00 PM on the fourth (4<sup>th</sup>) Wednesday of the month.

## 2018 Budget Message from the Township Manager Continued

The Facilities and Parks Budgets also include an addition of garage space to the Township Building. An emergency generator will continue to be pursued at the Community Building as well as a coating on the roof of the building, upgrades to the fire alarm system and a feasibility study of the Fire Department's space for possible improvements is also scheduled. The Township has applied for grant funding to complete floodplain improvements on the old Mid-Atlantic Golf Course property and is pursuing a master Recreation Plan for the property to be developed for additional recreational services. Design and permitting to retro-fit the Wyngate Stormwater Retention area is also planned. The Sewer Collection System is currently under a consent order with the Department of Environmental Protection to resolve infiltration and inflow into the system. We have budgeted significant funds to make repairs as breaks, cracks or leaks are discovered within the system. Beginning in 2018, a multi-year phased project for both water and sewer line replacements will begin in the Andover Development. Roads included in the first phase include: Andover Drive (from the back side of the development to Huntington Road) Huntington Road, and Essex Road.

The Sewer Authority has contracted for an upsize project to the Palomino Road Interceptor from Route 74 (near Thornton Automotive) to west of Stonehouse Lane. A portion of the Joint Use line (located along the Little Conewago Creek) from the WWTP to Bull Road is currently under design to upsize the line as well with bidding expected in 2018. A new line north of the Borough is also under design to encourage future business growth. Additionally, plans are being made to look at the replacement/upsizing of portions of the Fox Run Interceptor in 2018. The WWTP Plant is nearing completion of its Belt Press Replacement Project. The belt presses have been replaced with centrifuge technology. The WWTP will also be upgrading its emergency generator to the operations building.

The Water System continues to work toward improvements of a new well location, replacing water line in the Andover Development as detailed in the above paragraph, and engineering water line replacement on Route 74 North of the Borough to coincide with the Sewer line installation also noted above. Well Analysis continues in an effort to prepare for our Water Allocation Permit Renewal in 2018. In addition, the Township is pursuing several grants for planning and hazard mitigation. Two grants were applied for in 2017 to complete updates to the Borough/Township Joint Comprehensive Plan, through York County Community Block Grant Program and the Department of Community and Economic Development Municipal Assistance Program. This update will establish planning needs to the next ten years. In addition, the Township has applied for a second Hazard Mitigation Program Grant which would buyout homes located along Pine Road and the Little Conewago Creek that are prone to flooding.

## PENN WASTE, INC. Proper Mobile Cart Placement

#### Dear Resident,

Please be advised that all mobile carts should be placed BEHIND THE CURB. There should be nothing placed in the roadway that would impede or delay the removal of snow or ice from the road. The garbage truck arm has the capability to reach past the curb in order to pick up your cans.

Here are some tips to ensure a smooth collection process:

- · Set mobile cart out by your start time.
- Place mobile cart with the lid opening towards the road.
- Do not place cart in the roadway.
- DO NOT block walkways with carts.
- Place carts at least THREE FEET APART from each other and mailboxes, fire hydrants, low hanging trees or shrubs, parked cars, or utility poles - so trucks can easily access the cart.

#### DOVER TOWNSHIP RECYCLING GUIDELINES

Acceptable Items —Aluminum food and beverage containers, Glass food and beverage containers-brown, clear or green, Bi-Metal, Steel and Aerosol cans, PET Plastic Containers with the symbol #1 narrow neck containers only, HDPE Plastic containers with the symbol #2 narrow neck containers such as milk and water bottles, detergent, shampoo, bleach bottles, etc. without caps, Plastics with symbols #3, #4, #5, #6, #7 narrow and screw top containers, Newsprint, Cardboard-flattened in 2'x2' bundles (may be placed in recycling bin along other recycling), Residential mixed paper (Junk Mail, Magazines, Telephone Books, Printer/Copier Paper) Cereal Boxes.

Non-Acceptable Items- Window or Auto Glass, Drinking Glasses, Mirrors, Light Bulbs, Ceramic, Porcelain, Microwave Trays, Glass Cookware/Bakeware, Unnumbered Plastic Items, Plastic Bags, Salad/Deli Containers, Shredded Paper, Plastic Food Tubs, Household Items such as cooking pots, Batteries, Cardboard/Paper with wax coating or liners, Scrap Metal, Siding.

## Landscape & Plant wisely!

Beautifully landscaped yards can be a joy to homeowners that can turn into expensive nightmares. Roots from trees can invade building sewers and laterals. Roots thrive in the warm, moist, nutrient-rich atmosphere above the water level inside sanitary sewers. The flow of warm water inside the sewer pipe causes water vapor to escape to the cold and/or dry soil surrounding the pipe. Tree roots are attracted to the water vapor leaving the pipe and they follow the vapor trail to the source of the moisture, which is usually from cracks or loose joints in the sewer pipe. Tree roots will penetrate the opening to reach the nutrients and moisture inside the pipe. This continues in winter even though trees appear to be dormant. Severe root intrusion and structurally damaged pipes will require replacement. Tree roots growing inside sewer pipes can become a costly problem for township residents.

The best way to avoid this situation is to plant wisely. Do not plant trees within 20 feet from any building sewer, lateral, or sewer main. That small little twig that you plant today can grow into a big tree in a few years. Roots can travel far underground, across property lines and under paved roads. Minimize future problems by planning and planting wisely.

## A little Reminder from your Township Zoning Officer

## Any property owner in Dover

Township that has sidewalks on their property is responsible for removing snow/ice from sidewalks after snow/ice within 24 hours and after snow/ice has ceased to fall. You must clear a pathway at least 36 inches in width for the entire length of the portion of sidewalk in front of or abutting such property. The owner of such property shall be responsible for conforming to these requirements even where such property is occupied by someone other than the owner or is unoccupied. Also, remember, snow is NOT allowed

to be thrown/ shoveled or blown (snow blower) unto the street.

A Message from your Township Public Works Director BRIDGE WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS

As a result of a bridge inspection that identified new cracks in a bridge beam, D. E. Gemmill has assisted the Dover Township Public Works Department with removing and repainting traffic lines on the Fox Run Road Bridge (#366). An engineer from C. S. Davidson recently contacted the Township about transverse cracks that will greatly reduce the load carrying capacity of the beams (and bridge). These cracks will lead to the posting of a weight restriction on the bridge that could affect your travel along Fox Run Road (near Brookside Park) between Palomino Road and Oak Lane. The Safe Load Capacity Analysis results indicate a weight restriction of 16 tons (single vehicles) or 23 tons (combination vehicles), the Township staff will erect signs at the bridge and at the intersections prior to the bridge to warn motorist of the restriction.

Fox Run Road Bridge is the third bridge township owned bridge this year that due to bi-annual inspections and tighter PennDOT bridge regulations that has had weight restrictions posted. Earlier in the year, Butter Road Bridge (#367) and Rohlers Church Road Bridge (#426) were also posted with weight restrictions. Butter Road Bridge is posted 27 tons maximum gross single vehicle and 39 tons combination vehicles. Rohlers Church Road Bridge is posted 33 tons maximum gross single vehicle weight and 40 tons combination vehicles.

## Put A Freeze on Winter Fires

Heating, holiday decorations, winter storms and candles all contribute to an increased risk of fire during the winter months. NFPA and the U.S. Fire Administration are teaming up to help reduce your risk to winter fires and other hazards, including carbon monoxide and electrical fires.

Heating

Heating is the second leading cause of U.S. home fires, deaths and injuries. December, January and February are the peak months for heating fires. Space heaters are the type of equipment most often involved in home heating equipment fires, figuring in two of every five fires (40%). More statistics on heating fires.

Carbon Monoxide

Often called the invisible killer, carbon monoxide (CO) is an odorless, colorless gas created when fuels such as gasoline, wood, coal, propane, etc. do not burn. In the home, heating and cooking equipment that burn fuel are potential sources of CO. Carbon monoxide incidents are more common during the winter months, and in residential properties. More statistics on carbon monoxide incidents.

Winter storms

Most of the U.S. is at risk for winter storms, which can cause dangerous and sometimes life-threatening conditions. Blinding winddriven snow, extreme cold, icy road conditions, downed trees and power lines can all wreak havoc on our daily schedules. Home fires occur more in the winter than in any other season, and heating equipment is involved in one of every six reported home fires, and one in every five home fire deaths.

Generators

Portable generators are useful during power outages, however, many homeowners are unaware that the improper use of portable generators can be risky. The most common dangers associated with portable generators are carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning, electrical shock or electrocution, and fire hazards. According to a 2013 Consumer Product Safety Commission report, half of the generator-related deaths happened in the four coldest months of the year, November through February, and portable generators were involved in the majority of carbon monoxide deaths involving engine-driven tools.

Candles

December is the peak time of year for home candle fires; the top four days for home candle fires are New Year's Day, Christmas, New Year's Eve and Christmas Eve. Each year between 2009 and 2013, an average of 25 home candle fires were reported each day. More statistics on candle fires.

Electrical

Electrical home fires are a leading cause of home fires in the U.S. Roughly half of all home electrical fires involved electrical distribution or lighting equipment, while nearly another half involved other known types of equipment like washer or dryer fans, and portable or stationary space heaters. More statistics on electrical fires.

Christmas tree disposal

Christmas trees are combustible items that become increasing flammable as they continue to dry out in your home. Nearly 40 percent of home fires that begin with Christmas trees occur in January. Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur they're much more likely to be serious. More statistics on Christmas tree fires.

A live Christmas tree burn conducted by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) shows just how quickly a dried out Christmas tree fire burns, with flashover occurring in less than one minute, as compared to a well-watered tree, which burns at a much slower rate.
