

Place your brush along the public (township or state) road before 7 A.M. on the date for your area of the township.

Brush should be within 5 feet of the curb or edge of road.

if the ground is soft or wet, we cannot reach the brush without causing damage to your property.

Length of the brush should be less than 8' long and 8" in diamteter.

Avoid placing brush behind, near, or around obstacles such as poles, mailboxes, etc.

Do not park in front of or on top of brush pile.

Stumps will not be collected.

Dover Township Spring Brush Collection Dates are as follows: APRIL 23RD, 2018 THRU MAY 25TH, 2018 Brush may be dropped off to the rear of the Township Building at 2480 West Canal Rd at the salt dome. The gate is open from 7 am to 4 pm every second and fourth Saturdays.

This drop off is for residents of Dover Township only.






DOVER TOWNSHIP RECYCLING GUIDELINES

Acceptable Items—Aluminum food and beverage containers, Glass food and beverage containers-brown, clear or green, Bi-Metal, Steel and Aerosol cans, PET Plastic Containers with the symbol #1 narrow neck containers only, HDPE Plastic containers with the symbol #2 narrow neck containers such as milk and water bottles, detergent, shampoo, bleach bottles, etc. without caps, Plastics with symbols #3, #4, #5, #6, #7 narrow and screw top containers, Newsprint, Cardboard-flattened in 2'x2' bundles (may be placed in recycling bin along other recycling), Residential mixed paper (Junk Mail, Magazines, Telephone Books, Printer/Copier Paper)

Cereal Boxes.

Non-Acceptable Items- Window or Auto Glass, Drinking Glasses, Mirrors, Light Bulbs, Ceramic, Porcelain, Microwave Trays, Glass Cookware/Bakeware, Unnumbered Plastic Items, Plastic Bags, Salad/Deli Containers, Shredded Paper, Plastic Food Tubs, Household Items such as cooking pots, Batteries, Cardboard/Paper with wax coating or liners, Scrap Metal, Siding.

Dover Township Property Maintenance

Dover Township Property Maintenance Code, Chapter 3, Section 302.4 states in part that "all premises and exterior property shall be maintained free from weeds or plant growth in excess of twelve (12) inches. All noxious weeds shall be prohibited. Weeds shall be defined as all grasses, annual plants and vegetation, other than trees or shrubs provided however, this term shall not include cultivated flowers and gardens.



On Emergency Medical Services for Dover Township Residents

The Dover Area has a new Paramedic Intercept unit that comes out of the Dover Twp. Fire Department on Davidsburg Road. This unit previously known as Memorial Hospital Medic 98 is now Community Life Team out of Harrisburg PA. A lot of questions have come to Dover Ambulance about this new service, so let's see if we can clear some of them up. How does Community Life Team paramedics arrive at my door and what if I don't want a paramedic unit? When 911 is called a dispatcher follows a protocol. If the symptoms described are life threatening (breathing problem, heart issues, unconscious, accident or etc.) an automatic dispatch for Advanced Life Support will be put out for crew response. Dover Ambulance has no say on initial dispatch whether you get an Advanced Life Support unit, it is all part of the 911 dispatch system to get you the proper help for the symptoms described when you call 911.

Will I get a bill for the paramedic unit? Yes, the minimum costs start at \$700. This is in addition to the bill for Dover Ambulance.

If I refuse the paramedic unit, will I still get a bill? Yes once an patient assessment has been done there will be a bill.

Does Dover Ambulance Membership cover this bill? No, Community Life Team is a separate company.

Please keep in mind, that most insurances have copays and/or deductibles, this is the portion the patient has agreed to pay for each service provided, you will be responsible for that part of the bill. If you do not have insurance that covers ambulance service you will be responsible for the entire

Let's clear up some misconceptions about calling an ambulance!

Just because you call an ambulance for transport, doesn't mean you're going to be seen sooner at the hospital. Only life-threatening emergencies get a immediate room, otherwise you will be taken to triage or the waiting room and be seen in the order in which your emergency presents. An ambulance does not mean faster service at hospital UNLESS it is a life or death event!

Sump Pumps into the Sanitary Sewer Cause Big Problems!

Besides the fact that connecting sump pumps to the sanitary sewer is illegal, it causes big problems! Sump pumps are designed to pump groundwater and rainwater. Sanitary sewer pipes are designed to carry sewage, not groundwater and rain water.

Usually, the sanitary sewer pipe in the street is only 8 inches in diameter, and often the pipe slope is not very steep.

Many 8 inch sewer pipes are installed with a slope of 0.4%. This means that for every 100 feet of pipe, the pipe goes downhill less than 5 inches. This low slope condition is very common in Pennsylvania's sewer collection systems. As you can imagine, there is only so much sewage water that can flow through this pipe.

For this type of sewer pipe, about 300 gallons of water can flow through it in a minute. If more sewage than this tries to get through the pipe in the street, the sewage will surcharge, that is start filling up the sewer lateral pipes that run to the sewer main from houses. When even more sewage or extra water is sent to the sewer pipe, it will surcharge even farther, eventually pushing back into someone's basement. The sewage might come out of a neighbor's basement toilet or washing machine drain for example.

If hooked up to a house's sewer lateral, a half-horsepower sump pump will pump about 60 gallons to the sewer each minute. That means that if 5 pumps are connected to the sewer, it will be full. Normal sewage flows often fill the sewer main more than half-way already. So if two or three neighbors in a block illegally connect their sump pumps to their sewer lateral, the flow that is trying to get through the sewer main will be more than its capacity of 300 gallons per minute. The sewage in the pipe is going to start backing up!

It is critical that sump pumps discharge to the yard or storm sewer, not to the sanitary sewer. It is illegal to connect your sump pump into your sanitary lateral, and it can cause serious problems!

"I&I" is a short acronym for a huge problem

most sewered communities face, <u>Infiltration</u> and <u>Inflow</u>. **Inflow** occurs when rainwater is misdirected into the sanitary sewer system instead of storm sewers. Examples are: roof leaders, footer drains, sump pumps, manhole covers, and cross connections from storm drains. The remedy for inflow is to remove improper connections to the sanitary sewer system. **Infiltration** occurs when ground water seeps into the sanitary sewer system through cracks or leaks in sewer pipes. The cracks or leaks may be caused by age related deterioration, loose joints, damage or root infiltration. The remedy for infiltration is repairing or replacing the leaking infrastructure. Ignored I&I results in excessive flows in the sewers and into the wastewater treatment plant. This becomes a very costly problem for all of us. I&I affects the quantity of wastewater that needs to be treated, the capacity of your community's sewer pipes, wastewater treatment plant and ultimately, the rates that we pay to operate and maintain them.

The worst impact of I&I is the likelihood that the sewage can overflow out of the sewer pipe and into our environment.

You can reduce I&I from your property:

- Check that rain gutters and outside drains are not connected to sewers.
- Avoid planting trees and shrubs over building sewers.
 The roots can damage the structure of the sewer pipe and cause leaks.
- Keep caps on your cleanouts. Lawn mowers have a tendency to break the plastic caps. Replacement lids are available at your local hardware store.
- Ensure that basement drains and sump pumps are not connected to the sanitary sewer.
- Replace any known broken, leaky or problem sections of sewer pipe that are located on your property.
