Dover Township and Dover Borough have obtained grant funding from the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development Municipal Assistance Program and the federal Community Development Block Grant, administered by York County, to update their Joint Comprehensive Plan from 2008. Herbert, Rowland and Grubic, Inc. (HRG) was selected through a request for proposal process as the consultant to guide this planning event. The Joint Comprehensive Plan document is a guide for our communities for the next ten years in all aspects of infrastructure and development planning. Industrial & Commercial Development Committee

The Dover Township Industrial and Commercial Development Committee promotes industrial and commercial activities that will expand the greater Dover area tax base. Planning Commission

The Dover Township Planning Commission is a five member Commission with one alternate member. The term of office is a five year staggered term. This Commission is an advisory body to the Board of Supervisors. The authority is granted by the Municipal Planning Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The local ordinance of control is the Subdivision and Land Development Plan of Dover Township and the Dover Township Comprehensive Plan. Meetings are held at the Township Municipal Building, **2480 West Canal Road, Dover, Pennsylvania**, at 7:00 PM on the first (1st) Wednesday of the month.

Sewer Authority

The Dover Township Sewer Authority is the owner and financier of the Wastewater Treatment Facility, a regional facility, for Dover Township. The body is a five member, staggered term, Authority authorized by the Authorities Act of 1945 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is a Non-Operating Authority due to a "Lease Back Agreement" of operation to the Township. Meetings are held at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, **851 Graffius Road, York, Pennsylvania**, at 7:00 PM on the fourth (4th) Wednesday of the month.

From the Dover Township Water/Sewer Billing Department:

PLEASE NOTE: FAILURE TO RECEIVE A BILL DOES NOT VOID RESPONSIBILITY FOR ITS PAYMENT OR WAIVE THE PAST DUE PENALTY.

A 10% penalty is imposed on current charges not paid by the due date. All water and sewer bills are due by the 15th of the month unless the 15th falls on a weekend or holiday. If the 15th falls on a weekend or holiday, due date will be the following business day.

There is a rate change for water service in Dover Township for 2019. The rate change for residential water service is \$39.00 for the 1^{st} 6,000 gallons of water usage. Every additional 1,000 gallon will be charged at \$5.90.

Friendly reminder: Dover Township water and sewer bills no longer come in a postcard format. All water and sewer bills come in a bill statement form in an envelope from Dover Township.

Note: The roads listed have been designated as snow emergency routes. No person shall operate a motor vehicle on the designated roads in a manner that may cause the vehicle to become stalled either by not being properly equipped with chains or effective snow tires or running out of gas. The term motor vehicles also include, but are not limited to snowmobiles, trailers, three-wheeled and four-wheeled vehicles. If a snow emergency is declared, parking on these streets is prohibited until the emergency is declared terminated. Snow Emergency information will be available on our website and reported to local news.

Things to Keep in Mind...

- If a storm is anticipated, remove vehicles from the roadside shoulders. This allows plows to clear the area the first time through, making return trips unnecessary.
- Do not shovel snow into the road or have your driveway plowed into the road. This can cause a serious traffic hazard.
- If possible, wait until the road has been plowed before cleaning out the end of your driveway.
 There is no practical way to plow the road without depositing snow into your driveway.
- Plow operators are urged to take precautions to avoid hitting mailbox posts. Experience has shown that reduced visibility during a storm makes it difficult for a driver to see a post in time to avoid striking it or pushing it over with plowed snow. Any installation within the right-of-way, including a mailbox is placed there at the owner's own risk.
- Do not be misled by trucks running with their plows raised. They may be returning for fuel or they may be headed to another area. The municipality may not be responsible for all roads in the area. Some roads may be maintained by the state, some by the county, and some roads may be private (as in developments where roads have not yet been dedicated).

DOVER TOWNSHIP BULK ITEMS GUIDELINES

Dover Township residents may dispose of one (1) bulk item per week through curb side collection. Please have your waste, recycling and bulk item available for collection at the curb by 6 AM. A bag of trash does not count as a bulk item.

Accepted Materials

Appliances, furniture, mattresses, box springs, one (1) car tire without the rim, lawn mowers (oil and gasoline removed), plumbing fixtures such as toilets and sinks, three (3) 4-foot rolls of carpet (tied).

Non-Acceptable Materials

Electronic Waste (computers, televisions, etc.) chemicals, stains, liquids, batteries, automobile parts, hazardous waste, tires on rims, commercial/industrial waste, construction materials (drywall, brick, block, lumber, shingles, tiles, concrete).

Additional Instructions

Items which are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people will not be accepted. Additional trash bags are NOT considered a bulk item.

YORK COUNTY SOLID WASTE AUTHORITY



DAAC had an unexpected major break down of the 2009 Ambulance in October. The truck was 10 years old and needed a repair over \$5000. The decision was made to use money as a down payment for a new re-chassis of the old box on a 2019, gas engine Ford E-450 chassis. This will be the old patient compartment boxes 3rd re-chassis but why waste a good thing - recycle. The cost of this transformation will be \$100,000 which is still cheaper than the typical cost of \$200,000. Dover Ambulance will be doing a fundraiser this spring, as our costs go up and funding is going down. Subscription cards are available in the lobby.

2019 Budget Message from the Township Manager

Dover Township has experienced much growth over the last 15 years. That growth has required thoughtful planning on the expansion of our departments. During that timeframe, the Township has only increased real estate taxes once in 2008, when the millage rate was increased from .828 to 1.0 mil of tax. This year the Township Budget experienced some significant cost issues that have resulted in the need for a tax increase to 1.3 mils. The Township has undergone a garage expansion project, which was sorely needed for better efficiency of operations and future growth. That project was financed through a bond issue. Unfortunately, as sometimes happens with projects such as this, change orders related mostly to rock that was encountered with utility relocations has forced the Township to borrow more funds. We could not make this additional debt service without a tax increase. In addition to that, wet weather has wreaked havoc with Township infrastructure. Although we were certainly lucky by comparison to some parts of York County, stormwater washouts of culvert pipes, bridge deterioration and road maintenance have been affected by this wet weather. In order to continue to invest in this infrastructure, the Township needs this millage increase. Lastly, as you may have seen in the news, stormwater has become an ever-growing cost for communities. Dover Township is a permitted municipality through the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System Program (MS4). Our permit requires pollution reduction in sediment, phosphorus and nitrogen. These reductions are coming from investment in projects to restore our watershed to improvement the Chesapeake Bay. We have chosen to join the York County Stormwater Coalition to fund these projects with 41 other municipalities, so that the money can be invested in the best projects to get us to that goal. Due to the size of our Township, its population, and the number of streams we have running through it, our five-year budget investment in the Pollution Reduction Plan, is \$202,542 per year. Additionally, our Northern Regional Police Department contribution was increased by \$203,159. We simply could not endure these costs and continue to fund our infrastructure without a tax increase.



2019 will include various road and stormwater improvements. In addition, to continuing to address storm damage that occurred at a culvert on Conewago Road and Fish and Game, which has been delayed due to DEP requiring another permit for the project, Poplars Road will also have a pipe replaced that was damaged this summer. A left turn lane that is scheduled to be installed on Davidsburg Road near Tower Drive and Jayne Lane will be finalized. Rohler's Church Road will be paved from Bull to Circle Drive. Stormwater pipe will be lined on Jessica Road and Abby Lane. We also are entering into an agreement to lease purchase a new street sweeper.

The Budget also includes maintenance work to the Township Community Building to seal the roof over the Dover Library, Heritage Senior Center and Community Room. The roof over the Fire Department was completed in 2018.

The Sanitary Sewer System is currently under a consent order with the Department of Environmental Protection to resolve infiltration and inflow into the system. We have budgeted significant funds to begin a line replacement project in the Andover Subdivision and in the future Eagle View Park. Additional lining is anticipated, but a project location has not been selected to date. We will engineer for the replacement of portions of the Fox Run Interceptor this year. The Sewer Authority has awarded a contract to Anrich, Inc. for upsizing the Palomino Road Interceptor, which should begin this winter. A portion of the Joint Use line (located along the Little Conewago Creek) is currently being finalized for bid in early 2019. This project will include a new headworks for the Wastewater Treatment Plant, which will aid in screening items that are harmful to the pumps at the plant. A new line north of Dover Borough for future business growth, is currently in design and permitting.

The Water System continues to work toward engineering a water line replacement on Route 74 North of Dover Borough to coincide with the Sewer line installation. A portion of the Andover Subdivision will receive new water lines. Two new trucks will also be purchased for the department. A water rate increase of \$4.01 per quarter on the first 6,000 gallons used and \$.35 increase per 1,000 gallon after the first 6,00 was authorized in the budget as well. It has been 2 years since the last rate increase.
