DOVER TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WORK SESSION

January 11, 2021

The Dover Township Board of Supervisors' Meeting for Monday, January 11th, 2021, was called to order at 7:00 PM by the Chairman Stephen Stefanowicz. Supervisors present were Stephen Parthree, Michael Cashman, Robert Stone, and Charles Richards. Other Township Representatives in attendance were Laurel Oswalt, Township Manager; John McLucas, Township Zoning Officer; Michael Fleming, Township Public Works Director, Charles Rausch, Township Solicitor; and Tiffany Strine, Township Secretary. This meeting is being recorded for the purpose of minutes only.

A PowerPoint Presentation on Snow Emergency Routes and Weight Restrictions was reviewed by M. Fleming, Public Works Director (a copy is attached to the minutes for reference).

M. Fleming reported that the two matters before the Board of Supervisors were reviewed in a meeting with staff and Supervisor Richards the previous week. As a result of the December 16, 2020 snowstorm discussions began on staff about the lack of enforcement of snow emergency routes in several developments in the Township. It was determined that a previous Board of Supervisors authorized snow emergency routes in several developments at the request of the then Highway Foreman because these vehicles posed an issue in clearing the streets during the storm. However, they are not streets that are deemed by the Comprehensive Plan as collector or arterial. Northern Regional does not have the time to issue parking tickets during a significant storm and the fine is rather minor so obtaining cooperation from the residents has been sporadic. In the Stonebridge Crossing and Glen Hollow subdivisions, Mr. Fleming noted that he had pictures of 17 cars that had not been moved within 24 hours of the snow emergency being declared. In fact, those same cars were still present two days later as noted in the presentation and had not been touched after the storm.

- R. Stone questioned towing the cars. M. Fleming indicated that towing cars is made a priority if the vehicle is disabled and blocking traffic, but vehicles that are parked along the road are low priority. Other options beyond towing include five days in jail per the present ordinance.
- R. Stone questioned why we would not do what it takes to enforce the ordinance in these developments or do away with the concept entirely if we cannot enforce the ordinance due to lack of resources. C. Richards noted that the roads that are marked to stay in and be added to the ordinance are major roads that really do not have parking along them. Manager Oswalt added that snow emergency routes are also the priority to keep open during storms and require vehicles to have chains or snow tires for traveling. There is therefore more to the ordinance then the parking limitations.
- M. Fleming noted that the recommendation is to <u>remove</u> the following streets from the snow emergency list: Blue Jay Drive, Condor Lane, Falcon Lane, Glen Hollow Drive, Long Meadow Drive, Milky Way Road, Rainbow Circle, Solar Drive Spectrum Road, Sundial Road, Sunshine Drive, Timberlyn Drive, and Weeping Willow Lane. This is due to the fact that these roads are mainly residential. Additionally, it is recommended the following streets be <u>added</u> to the snow emergency list: Palomino Road, Conewago Road, Grenway Road, Nursery Road, Oakland Road, Newport Road, Tower Drive and Cardinal Lane.

The Board was asked for their consensus to move forward with making these changes via amendment to the current ordinance.

M. Fleming noted at the last Board of Supervisors Meeting in December, the issue of the Baker Road Bridge detour over Emig Mill Road prompted a discussion about the weight restriction on that road. The weight restriction does not have an ordinance to permit its enforcement. In fact, with the exception of the four bridges listed in Appendix J5 of the Township's Codified Ordinances, none of the streets listed appear to have a traffic study in place to warrant their enforcement: Those bridges are: Bridge # 366, Fox Run Road; Bridge # 367, Butter Road; Bridge # 424, Clearview Road; and Bridge # 426, Rohlers Church Road. Additionally, the restrictions noted in the ordinance on some of the roads are 4.5 to 6 tons which many personal trucks of residents actually exceed these weight restrictions. M. Fleming noted that a great deal of the roads in the current ordinance are in the Sunrise Acres Subdivision which would not likely meet the warrants for the restriction.

M. Fleming indicated it is the recommendation that these restrictions be removed via ordinance amendment also. The roads to be removed are Alta Vista Road, Chickadee Drive, Clearview Road, Cypress Road, East Farm Circle, East Pheasant Circle, Emig Mill Road, Farm Drive East, Night-In-Gale Circle, North Pheasant Circle, Partridge Circle, Ruffed Grouse Drive, South East Pheasant Circle, and South Partridge Drive.


Consensus of the Board of Supervisors was to prepare the ordinance for advertisement as requested in the presentation.


With no further business, the meeting was adjourned to an Executive Session on Personnel by Chairman Stefanowicz at 6:30 PM.




Snow Emergency Routes Weight Restrictions



ISSUANCE OF PERMITS AND THE POSTING OF SECURITY FOR THE MOVEMENT OF VEHICLES OF A WEIGHT IN EXCESS OF RESTRICTIONS, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS. TOWNSHIP OF ____ COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA ORDINANCE NO.

BE IT ORDAINED AND RESOLVED, and it is hereby ordained and resolved, by the Board of Supervisors of

, and Commonwealth of County of Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE

This Ordinance shall be known as 'Motor Vehicle Weight Limitation and Bonding Ordinance of Township".

SECTION 2. ENACTMENT

17, 1962, No. 81, Section 1, effective July 1, 1977 (75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101 et seq.), as amended and is intended to include and be subject to all provisions of Section 4902 of the "Vehicle Code", 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 4902 and all Pennsylvania Department of Transportation regulations promulgated under the "Vehicle Code", by vay of illustration and not limitation, under Sections 4902(1) and 6103 (75 Pa. C.S.A. § ~4902(1) and 6103). This Ordinance is enacted pursuant to the authority conferred by the "Vehicle Code", Act of 1976, June

SECTION 3. DEFINITIONS

The following words when used in this Ordinance shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: Emergency Vehicle — a fire department vehicle, police vehicle, ambulance, blood delivery vehicle, Armed Forces emergency vehicle, one private vehicle of a fire or police chief or assistant chief, or ambulance corps commander or assistant commander, or of a river rescue commander used for answering emergency cells, or other vehicle designated by the State Police under section 6106 of the "Vehicle Code" (relating to designation of emergency vehicles by Pennsylvania State Police).

Excess maintenance - Maintenance or restoration or both (but not betterment) of a posted highway in excess of normal maintenance, caused by use of over-posted-weight vehicles.







