Public Meetings

Board of Supervisors

The Board of Supervisors will hold their regular meetings in the Township Municipal Building, 2480 West Canal Road, Dover, Pennsylvania, at 7:00 PM on the second (2nd) and fourth (4th) Mondays of the month. The Dover Township Board of Supervisors invites the public to attend.

Industrial & Commercial Development Committee

Planning Commission

The Dover Township Planning Commission is a five member Commission with one alternate member. The term of office is a five year staggered term. This Commission is an advisory body to the Board of Supervisors. The Authority is granted by the Municipal Planning Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The local ordinance of control is the Subdivision and Land Development Plan of Dover Township and the Dover Township Comprehensive Plan. Meetings are held at the Township Municipal Building, 2480 West Canal Road, Dover, Pennsylvania, at 7:00 PM on the first (1st) Wednesday of the month.

Sewer Authority

The Dover Township Sewer Authority is the owner and financier of the Wastewater Treatment Facility, a regional facility, for Dover Township. The body is a five member, staggered term, Authority authorized by the Authorities Act of 1945 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is a Non-Operating Authority due to a "Lease Back Agreement" of operation to the Township. Meetings are held at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, 851 Graffius Road, York, Pennsylvania, at 6:00 PM on the fourth (4th) Wednesday of the month.

Zoning Hearing Board

The Dover Township Zoning Hearing Board is a five member Board. This body is a Quasi Judicial Body whose authority is granted by the Municipal Planning Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. There is one alternate member. The term is a five year staggered term. Local authority and guide line of operational decision is established by the Dover Township Zoning Ordinance and the Dover Township Comprehensive Plan. Meetings are held at the Township Municipal Building, 2480 West Canal Road, Dover, Pennsylvania, at 7:00 PM on the third (3rd) Wednesday of the month AS NEEDED. Please check www.dovertownship.org for details and updates on scheduled meetings.

DOVER TOWNSHIP ROAD WIDENING

On September 12th, Dover Township began working on widening Wren Rd from Pinchtown Rd to the Township line & on Pinchtown Rd from Admire Rd to the Township Line. These roads will be widened by 2 feet with full depth reclamation. Paving is to follow. This may cause traffic delays in these areas.

LEAF COLLECTION WILL BEGIN ON NOVEMBER 7TH THROUGH THE WEEK OF DECEMBER 12TH.

LEAVES MUST BE RAKED TO THE CURB OR ROADSIDE NO FURTHER THAN 3' BACK, SO THEY ARE ACCESSIBLE TO THE

EQUIPMENT USED TO VACUUM THE LEAVES.

PLEASE DO NOT PLACE BRUSH, GRASS CLIPPINGS OR BAMBOO OUT WITH YOUR LEAVES. OUR EQUIPMENT IS NOT DESIGNED TO VACUUM LONG OR HEAVY ITEMS AND IT COULD DAMAGE THE EQUIPMENT.

YOU MAY COVER YOUR LEAF PILES IF YOU CHOOSE SO YOUR LEAVES DO NOT BLOW AWAY. PLEASE DO NOT PLACE YOUR LEAF PILES NEAR STREET SIGNS, UTILITY POLES OR MAILBOXES. OUR CREWS WILL NOT DRIVE ONTO THE PROPERTY TO PICK UP LEAVES.

ANY REMAINING LEAVES WILL NEED TO BE RAKED BACK OUT TO THE ROADSIDE FOR PICK UP.

THE SAFETY OF OUR CREWS IS VERY IMPORTANT, SO PLEASE USE CAUTION WHEN PASSING WORK CREWS ALONG THE ROADWAYS.

DEP OFFERS TIPS ON HOW TO PROPERLY CLOSE SWIMMING POOLS BY VIRGINIA CAIN | PA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

Football is back, and the last of the hot summer days are upon us. In an effort to help protect stream health and aquatic life, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) would like to offer some helpful tips and (not so) gentle reminders on how to properly close swimming pools for the year. Whether you're a private owner, manage a public pool or work for a pool maintenance company, these reminders are for you!

Discharged pool water and waters containing chlorine or other chemicals can be detrimental to aquatic life if not handled responsibly. It is extremely important that these waters are handled correctly. Pool waters must not be discharged to any storm sewer or land in which a storm sewer is accessible because runoff can cause fish kills and unsafe aquatic conditions.

When draining a swimming pool this year, make sure to protect Pennsylvania by following these tips:

- Pool water may be disposed of through the sanitary sewer system ONLY with municipal permission.
- Never dispose of pool water through a storm sewer, which will discharge to a stream.
- If lowering the water level of the pool, let it drain to a lawn to prevent it from running off into a storm sewer.
- If a sanitary sewer system is not available, water may be used for irrigation if it does not run off the property
 or into a storm sewer.

And don't forget: The discharge of swimming pool water to any waters of the commonwealth without a permit is a violation of the Clean Streams Law. Property owners and pool companies that violate this law may be prosecuted and penalized for damages. Don't let this happen to you!

Should I Flush My Water Heater?

Yes! It is recommended that you flush your water heater at least once per year.

Your water heater needs regular maintenance as does other machines such as your car. Over time, water heaters collect things such as sediment, calcium, and minerals that settles at the bottom of the tank. The heating element of a water heater is at the bottom of the tank. If this heat is being blocked by sediment and other materials, then your water heater has to work harder to heat the water.

Bridge Closures in Dover Township

Dover Township has contracted for repairs and/or replacements to bridges located throughout the township. While work is being completed this fall/winter season several bridges will need to be closed for work to be completed.

- Fox Run Road Bridge between Brookside Park and Palomino Road will be closed for 3 months starting September 12th
- Butter Road Bridge near Fox Run Road will be closed for 3 months starting September 19th
- Clearview Road Bridge just north of Davidsburg Road is delayed due to Columbia Gas but will need a closure for a significant length of time pending completion of their relocation work
- There are 11 other small bridges that are getting minor work completed which will not call for complete road closures but will cause delays as crews complete the work.

As additional information becomes available we will post it our website and social media as we are made aware of the contractor's schedule. This is a significant investment in Township infrastructure. Approximately \$2 million is being used to fund these needed improvements.

A NOTE FROM DOVER AMBULANCE CLUB

Started by the Lions Club in 1958, DAAC is a Nonprofit, Basic Life Support Ambulance Service for Dover and the surrounding communities for 64 years. Two paid EMT's staff the ambulance 24/7 at 40 East Canal Street in Dover Borough. DAAC is NOT associated with the two Dover Fire Departments. DAAC does not receive tax subsidies and relies on your continued support thru subscription and tax deductible donations to offset the costs of providing 911 ambulance service.

What are the benefits of a subscription?

Your support helps EMS to continue to provide 911 service with equipment repair, upkeep and purchases of new equipment as needed. Includes "3" responses during the subscription year. Eliminates expenses under certain circumstances for falls, refusals and non-transports normally \$200 fee included in three calls a year. On 911 transports, we cannot write off copays, deductibles and coinsurances, as this is your agreement with your chosen insurance provider for your portion of the bill. Subscription works in conjunction with insurance, check to see what your insurance covers, this subscription is not for a free ride. DAAC will bill your insurance company and send you a copy of the bill. When the check for your service arrives please pay your bill promptly, to avoid further actions with collections. If there is no insurance payment on the bill or no insurance, a 10% discount will be offered off the bill. This is for DAAC services only, we do not reciprocate. A subscriber shall receive "Emergency" 911 ambulance service by Dover Ambulance (DAAC), when available, with transport to the closest hospital in our responding area of your choice usually York or UPMC Hospitals. We greatly appreciate your support as we are not tax dollar supported.

Project Lifesaver

Project Lifesaver provides law enforcement with a program designed to protect, and when necessary, quickly locate individuals with cognitive disorders who are prone to the life threatening behavior of wandering. The necessity of this program was determined through the correlation between cognitive conditions and the act of wandering. The program has grown from a localized program to a program recognized internationally as a proven and effective method of "bringing loved ones home."

The method relies on proven radio technology and specially trained search and rescue teams. Citizens enrolled in Project Lifesaver wear a small transmitter on the wrist or ankle that emits an individualized frequency signal. If an enrolled client goes missing, the caregiver notifies their local Project Lifesaver agency, and a trained emergency team responds to the wanderer's area. The first responders will then use the client's individualized frequency to locate the position of the individual.

The Northern York County Regional Police Department has nine officers trained in the operation of the Project Lifesaver Program. Four of these officers are School Resource Officers.







10 Personal Finance Tips to Consider Before Year-End

With summer in the rearview mirror, it's important to reflect on 2022 as well as check-off items on your financial to-do list before the calendar flips to the New Year. Here are a few tips to consider before year-end.

- Ensure Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) are properly satisfied from relevant retirement accounts, if applicable.
- 2. Review amount and status of retirement account contributions and consider additional contributions within relevant annual limits if feasible. Maximize contributions to a Traditional and/or Roth IRA as appropriate if eligible and capitalize on any potential "catch-up" contributions if age 50 or older.
- 3.Initiate a review of your estate plan and ensure it remains consistent with your wishes. Ensure that appropriate beneficiaries are designated among all retirement accounts, insurance policies, and other benefit plans. Update wills and beneficiaries, and establish powers of attorney and advanced medical directives, if necessary.
- 4.If 70 ½ or older, initiate Qualified Charitable Distributions from IRAs to satisfy any charitable donation intentions.
- 5.Review portfolio allocation to ensure it remains aligned with your objectives and risk tolerance, and is appropriate given changing personal and/or market circumstances. Rebalance to intended portfolio targets as necessary given that its composition may have changed as markets fluctuate.
- Review investment positions in taxable accounts and harvest any available tax losses.
- 7. Review projected taxable income and capitalize upon potential tax planning opportunities. Ensure that available tax deductions are fully used to offset income and are not wasted. Consider the merits of Roth IRA conversions and/or additional taxable withdrawals from retirement accounts if necessary.
- 8. Consider taking advantage of the annual gift tax exclusion, currently \$16,000, to efficiently transfer monies to future heirs that might otherwise be subject to estate taxation.
- Review existing insurance policies including: homeowners, automobile, umbrella, life, disability; to ensure coverage is adequate and premiums are reasonable.

10.Assuming insufficient deductions are available to itemize, consider bunching several years of intended annual charitable donations into a single tax year by establishing a Donor Advised Fund (DAF) and issuing subsequent charitable grants from the fund over time as desired.


