Dover Township was honored to receive the 2023 Governor's Environmental Excellence Award for the Fox Run Floodplain Restoration in Eagle View Park! Dover Township was presented the award at a dinner on April 25th by Department of Environmental Protection Secretary, Richard Negrin and Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Secretary, Cindy Dunn. Our project was one of 20 projects Statewide selected for this honor. Funding for the project was made available through DEP's Growing Greener Program and the York County Stormwater Consortium. The project provides pollution reduction of approximately 175 tons of sediment annually, created 5 acres of wetlands, and aids with flooding as well as the park's stormwater management requirements for

the coming Eagle View Park Improvements. Additionally, the nutrient rich sediment removed from the stream was used to grade out the coming park amenities. The stream restoration has also brought a variety of birds and aquatic species back to the site. This project would not have been possible without the expertise of our project partners.Specifically, Land Studies (Design, Permitting and Construction Management), CS Davidson (Civil Engineering), YSM Landscape Architects (Park Master Planning, Design and Project Management), and Flyway Excavating, Inc. (Floodplain Restoration Site Work).Thank you so much for your hard work to make this project a reality and set the stage for Eagle View Park to be a unique experience for the entire community!

Board of Supervisors

Industrial & Commercial Development Committee

Planning Commission

The Dover Township Planning Commission is a five member Commission with one alternate member. The term of office is a five year staggered term. This Commission is an advisory body to the Board of Supervisors. The Authority is granted by the Municipal Planning Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The local ordinance of control is the Subdivision and Land Development Plan of Dover Township and the Dover Township Comprehensive Plan. Meetings are held at the Township Municipal Building, 2480 West Canal Road, Dover, Pennsylvania, at 7:00 PM on the first (1st) Wednesday of the month.

Sewer Authority

The Dover Township Sewer Authority is the owner and financier of the Wastewater Treatment Facility, a regional facility, for Dover Township. The body is a five member, staggered term, Authority authorized by the Authorities Act of 1945 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is a Non-Operating Authority due to a "Lease Back Agreement" of operation to the Township. Meetings are held at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, 851 Graffius Road, York, Pennsylvania, at 6:00 PM on the fourth (4th) Wednesday of the month.

Zoning Hearing Board

The Dover Township Zoning Hearing Board is a five member Board. This body is a Quasi Judicial Body whose authority is granted by the Municipal Planning Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. There is one alternate member. The term is a five year staggered term. Local authority and guide line of operational decision is established by the Dover Township Zoning Ordinance and the Dover Township Comprehensive Plan. Meetings are held at the Township Municipal Building, 2480 West Canal Road, Dover, Pennsylvania, at 7:00 PM on the third (3rd) Wednesday of the month **AS NEEDED**. The Conewago Creek and Little Conewago Creek serve as boundary lines for Dover Township. The two creeks are divided by a ridge of mountains that separates them into two drainage areas that both feed stormwater to the Susquehanna River and eventually the Chesapeake Bay. Proper management of stormwater is a federal, state, county, township and individual property owner responsibility.

What is Stormwater Management?

Stormwater is the result of precipitation and snow melt that runs off through streets, lawns, farms, and construction and industrial sites. Under normal conditions, stormwater is absorbed into the ground, filtered by the soil and replenishes our groundwater for our personal wells or the Dover Township

Water System. It also flows over land to our streams and rivers. In developed areas of our community, like building roofs and pavement, rain water and snow melt isn't able to seep into the ground. These impervious surfaces cause the water to run into storm drains, sewer systems and drainage areas. This rush of water can damage infrastructure, cause flooding, and erode the ground. Unfiltered bacteria and pollutants can be carried in this stormwater into our streams, rivers and coastal waters.
Common sources for stormwater pollution include: pet waste, leaves, grass clippings, detergents, fertilizers, oil and grease, and trash. Stormwater management is utilized to address these concerns through a variety of techniques, including site design, control measures for runoff, and purposeful landscaping.

What can you do?

-Keep pet waste, vehicle waste and grass clippings away from our storm drains.
-Clean up your pets waste.
-Use fertilizer sparingly.
-Plant trees along streams to help control erosion.
-Redirect your downspout onto lawn or natural areas or into rain barrels.
-Create a raingarden.

CLEARVIEW ROAD BRIDGE

CLEARVIEW ROAD BRIDGE IS IN THE PROCESS OF BEING REPLACED IN THE 5600 BLOCK OF CLEARVIEW ROAD. A SIGNED Detour was placed on harmony grove road due to other anticipated construction projects on york county and penndot bridges. Lobar site development is replacing the 74-year-old bridge at an estimated cost of \$751,341. This is the third of twelve bridges that the township has bundled together to replace or upgrade within the township. 



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DOVER TOWNSHIP HAS A STORMWATER ORDINANCE IN PLACE TO HELP PROTECT THE WATERS OF PENNSYLVANIA. "CHAPTER 19 STORMWATER MANAGEMENT" ILLICIT DISCHARGE- ANY DISCHARGE TO A MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORM SEWER THAT IS NOT COMPOSED ENTIRELY OF STORMWATER, EXCEPT NON-STORMWATER DISCHARGES AS DESCRIBED IN THE "DISCHARGES AUTHORIZED BY THIS GENERAL PERMIT" SECTION OF THIS GENERAL PERMIT. EXAMPLES OF ILLICIT DISCHARGES INCLUDE DUMPING OF MOTOR VEHICLE FLUIDS, HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTES, GRASS CLIPPINGS, LEAF LITTER, ANIMAL WASTES, OR UNAUTHORIZED DISCHARGES OF SEWAGE, INDUSTRIAL WASTE, RESTAURANT WASTES, OR ANY OTHER NON-STORMWATER WASTE INTO A MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORM SEWER SYSTEM. ILLICIT DISCHARGES CAN BE ACCIDENTAL OR INTENTIONAL. YARD WASTE DUMPED ALONG STREAM EDGES SUFFOCATES AND KILLS THE TREES AND SHRUBS THAT ARE CRITICAL FOR AVOIDING STREAM BANK EROSION. STORMS CAN EASILY WASH LAWN CLIPPINGS PILEO IN THE FLOODPLAIN INTO THE STREAM. YARD WASTE CARRIES A HARMFUL EXCESS OF NUTRIENTS TO THE STREAM, WHICH IN TURN ROBS THE STREAM OF OXYGEN NEEDED BY FISH AND AQUATIC INSECTS. NOT TO MENTION, THIS COULD ALSO CAUSE FLOODING ISSUES. IT CAN BLOCK ANY PIPE, INLET, OR OUTLET STRUCTURE. THIS BLOCKAGE MAY CAUSE THE WATER TO BACK UP AND DAMAGE YOUR OR YOUR NEIGHBOR'S PROPERTY. IF YOU DO NOT MULCH YOUR GRASS CLIPPINGS, THE PHOTOS ABOVE ARE OTHER WAYS TO PROPERLY DISPOSE YOUR GRASS CLIPPINGS.

Northern York County Regional PoliceImage: Second Project Lifesaver

Project Lifesaver provides law enforcement with a program designed to protect, and when necessary, quickly locate individuals with cognitive disorders who are prone to the life threatening behavior of wandering. The necessity of this program was determined through the correlation between cognitive conditions and the act of wandering. The program has grown from a localized program to a program recognized internationally as a proven and effective method of "bringing loved ones home."

The method relies on proven radio technology and specially trained search and rescue teams. Citizens enrolled in Project Lifesaver wear a small transmitter on the wrist or ankle that emits an individualized frequency signal. If an enrolled client goes missing, the caregiver notifies their local Project Lifesaver agency, and a trained emergency team responds to the wanderer's area. The first responders will then use the client's individualized frequency to locate the position of the individual.

The Northern York County Regional Police Department has nine officers trained in the operation of the Project Lifesaver Program. Four of these officers are School Resource Officers.
