## DOVER TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WORK SESSION MINUTES October 9th, 2023

The Dover Township Board of Supervisors Work Session for Monday, October 9<sup>th</sup>, 2023, was called to order at 6:01 PM by Vice Chairperson Robert Stone in the Dover Township Board of Supervisors meeting room. Supervisors present were Chuck Richards, Stephen Parthree, and Michael Cashman. Stephen Stefanowicz was absent with prior notification. Other Township Representatives in attendance were Laurel Oswalt, Township Manager; Michael Fleming, Public Works Director; Terry Myers, Township Engineer; Trena Hall, Township Treasurer; and Brooke Scearce, Township Secretary. There were 0 members of the public present.

This meeting is being recorded for the purpose of minutes only.

## DRAFT #2 OF THE 2024 BUDGET

The purpose of tonight's meeting was to review Draft #2 of the 2024 budget with the Board of Supervisors. Manager Oswalt reported that all funds were able to be balanced with the exception of liquid fuels, which has a projected carryover balance into 2025. Key highlights of each funds' projects and increases are detailed on a spreadsheet, which is supplemental to the Budget Document. Manager Oswalt asked if the Board had any specific matters that members wanted to review. A copy of the spreadsheet is attached for reference.

- C. Richards stated that he knows of a company in West Virginia that would possibly be interested in the Log Cabin, maybe the Township can reach out to them.
- M. Fleming stated the thought process was to advertise the Log Cabin on MuniciBid to see if there is interest in dismantling the building.
- S. Parthree noted that the highest bidder should be required to take the whole building and also require a bond.
- C. Richards questioned if there was money for road improvements on Intermediate Avenue.
- M. Fleming stated it has been pushed back due to the construction not being completed.

Manager Oswalt noted that warehouses on Bull Road will require water and sewer services to the property. The Township would collect \$971,000.00 for sewer tapping fees and roughly \$1.5 million for water tapping fees. There was a meeting last week with the developer to discuss a developer's agreement at which the Township would ask the developer to cover the cost of adding the water and sewer services and address the Fox Run Road Interceptor sanitary sewer issues in exchange for waving both the water and sewer tapping fees and the Township covering the cost of materials. This potential agreement is still in the process of negotiation.

Manager Oswalt stated that she could add \$1 million to be spent from sewer reserves and \$250,000.00 to water reserves as a cushion if the project would happen next year. These costs would cover the materials for the project.

The Board was in favor of adding extra funds to the water and sewer reserve funds in case the project would happen in 2024.

C. Richards questioned when the North of the Borough project will be starting.

Manager Oswalt stated that the last indication from the contractor was that work would be starting the week of October 23.

M. Fleming added that 90% of the work for the sewer lining for Cypress South is in the residents backyards or side yards. If there is not 100% participation from all the residents in that development, the work will not be able to be completed.

Manager Oswalt stated that the healthcare increase is as follows: 8.9% on medical/prescription plan, 0% on dental, and 0% on vision.

Additionally, Manager Oswalt stated that at the end of 2022 the water department borrowed money and it was determined that the water rates should be looked at for an increase in 2024 to ensure additional capital reserve funds for anticipated future capital projects. There was a rate study that was completed with two recommendations; a 5% rate increase in 2024 followed by a 2% rate increase in 2025 to generate 1.5 million in additional reserve funds or a 15% increase in 2024 followed by a 3% rate increase in 2025 to obtain \$2 million in reserve funds.

The Board was presented with a rate increase spreadsheet that was prepared by the Utility Billing Clerk to show the impacts on different size households.

R. Stone stated that it would be irresponsible not to keep the reserve fund where it is targeted, the Township needs to keep looking in the future.

Manager Oswalt stated that she is looking for direction as to whether or not the Board would like to have a rate increase and if so, how much of a rate increase.

C. Richards noted that the Dover Township rates are lower than the rates charged by the York Water Company.

Manager Oswalt stated that the rates charged by the Township include the York Water Company rates which continually get raised, since the Water System purchases water from them.

Consensus of the Board was to have a 9% rate increase in 2024 and a 9% rate increase in 2025 to recoup \$2 million in the water reserve budget.

With no further discussion on this matter, Vice Chairperson Robert Stone adjourned the Work Session at 6:48 PM to be followed by an Executive Session and then a Regular Board of Supervisors meeting at 7:01 PM.
