

OVERVIEW:

- A cold front is expected to approach central PA today bringing more showers and thunderstorms.
- Torrential downpours will accompany some of these showers and storms and pose a flooding threat (risk level 3 out of 4) today.

TIMING	 Isolated showers are ongoing this morning. Showers and storms will become more numerous starting late this morning over the central mountains then expand in coverage and persist into the evening, especially over the Lower Susquehanna Valley. 	
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	 Slow moving storms could produce torrential downpours and localized rainfall amounts exceeding 2 inches within a 1 to 2 hour period Monday afternoon and evening. Isolated strong to damaging thunderstorm winds are also possible. 	
NWS ALERTS	 A Flood Watch is in effect from 2PM this afternoon through Monday evening for the southeast corner of central Pennsylvania. 	
FORECAST CHALLENGES	 There is some uncertainty as to how long storms will persist over any given location. Slower overall system motion could prolong the heavy rain threat well into Monday night, especially near and east of I-83.
